Open to riders under the age of 10 as of January 01, 2026.

Open Equitation

Open to all!

Hack Division

Open to Horses and Ponies.

Leadline

Equitation to include a walk, sitting trot, halt and a horsemanship question. Riders are not permitted to cross-enter into any other division.

Junior/Adult Beginner Walk/Trot

Open to horses and ponies.

Not permitted to cross enter into cross-rail, short/long stirrup or 2ft.

Juniors and Adults will be judged separately depending on class numbers.

Junior/Adult Beginner Walk/Trot/Canter

Open to horses and ponies.

Not permitted to cross enter into short/long stirrup or 2ft.

Junior/Adult Beginner Pole Course

Open to horses and ponies.

Can be done at a trot or a canter.

Not permitted to cross-enter into short/long stirrup or 2ft.

Open Pole Course

Open to horses and ponies.

Can be done at a trot or a canter.

Open Cross-Rail Hunter Division

Open to all horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted.

Will consist of 2 courses and an under saddle class.

Short/Long Stirrup Hunter Division

Open to horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted.

Will consist of 2 courses and an under saddle class.

Short Stirrup: Restricted to riders 12 years of age and under.

Long Stirrup: Restricted to riders 13 years of age and over.

Heights will not exceed 18".

2ft Open Hunter Division

Open to all horses and ponies, distances will not be adjusted.
Will consist of 2 courses and an under saddle class.

Adult and Junior Divisions may be combined if entry numbers are low

If entries are low, equitation classes will run together as an "Open" class.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Administration and Entries

- Entries must be completed through the website. No paper or scanned entries will be accepted.
- Entries must be received on or before the closing date to avoid post-entry fees.
- ALL horses present on showgrounds must be vaccinated and have proof/certificate of vaccination. All horses must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.
 - a. All horses attending must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1 and 4) vaccinations within six (6) months (+21 days grace period) before arrival at the competition. No horse shall have received vaccination within seven (7) days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of competition management.
 - b. The frequency of vaccine administration should be as recommended by the vaccine manufacturer or veterinarian. It is recommended that vaccines be administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian. Competition Management may request supporting documentation confirming a horse's compliance with mandatory vaccination requirements.
 - c. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccines, a letter must be provided with the entry form from a veterinarian, stating the equine cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns. At the discretion of competition management, a log of the horse's temperature prior to arrival at the event site or during the event can be requested.

- Payment must be sent by e-transfer to everetthorseshow@gmail.com once you receive your invoice. Please include the rider's name in the message of your E-Transfer.
 - a. Please note that your entry will not be fulfilled and you will not be assigned a number until payment is received.
 - b. If you have any questions or difficulties with this process, please email everetthorseshow@gmail.com.
- It is the responsibility of the entrant to provide proof of timely entry submission should there be a disagreement regarding the time of entry. All entries will be marked with date/ time of reception.
- **Administration fee is non-refundable. No Exceptions.**
- Entry fees will be returned if cancelled in the show office 96 hours prior to the first class with proper medical documentation. Once a horse has entered the show grounds, there will be no refund unless authorized by the show management.
- No numbers will be issued without full payment. No numbers will be issued to any horse or rider for whom an entry form has not been fully completed.
- All NO SHOW entries, will be charged full entry fees and all other applicable fees. All accounts must be settled prior to the next show, otherwise, entries will be denied, an account management fee will be charged.
- **To ensure horse welfare, each horse may not compete in more than 2 divisions or 6 classes.**

- Scratched entries providing notification 24 hours in advance without a veterinarian certificate will be assessed a \$40.00 scratch fee and charged administration fees. All unpaid fees will be considered an outstanding account until paid in full. Any classes/divisions entered but not completed will be charged. There will be no refund for classes scratched on the day of competition for any reason without a scratch note received by the office.
- You may change from one class/division to another at no additional charge as long as it has been cleared by the show administrator.

General

- All riders must wear their number when mounted.
- Show Management reserves the right to change or amend show schedules up to one (1) hour prior.
- After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring.
- Horses found to be unsound or lame will be excused by the judge or an appointed representative of the Everett Horse Show.
- Any mistreatment or abuse of horses will not be tolerated at any Everett Horse Show. Any person doing so will be asked to leave the show grounds immediately.
- Alcohol is not permitted on showgrounds.

- Everett Horse Show holds no liability for loss, accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, riders, owners, spectators, or any person or property whatsoever.
- Management reserves the right to limit or close the entries of any classes or divisions in an effort to adhere to the schedule.
- All entry forms must be signed by the competitor if they are an adult, and must have a parent/guardian signature for juniors.
- All participants under 18 must be accompanied by a parent, legal guardian, or trainer.
- Coaches/Trainers are not allowed to sign for competitors. No competitor will be allowed to show without the required signature and will be liable for administration fees and scratch fees.

Tack and Apparel

- All tack and apparel should be clean, neat and in good repair.
- Proper show attire is recommended for all divisions and classes. Jackets may be excused at the discretion of our judges.
- All tack should be properly fitted.
- For all classes, the judge or steward may prohibit the use of any bit or equipment they consider inhumane, unsafe, or would tend to give a horse/rider an unfair advantage.

- ALL competitors must wear proper fitting, approved protective headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured, at all times while mounted on show grounds. Headgear must meet the ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) standards and display the SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) seal. The British standard, BSI, is also acceptable.
- Riders will not be penalized for wearing safety vests.
- Bitless bridles are permitted.
- All bits must be humane in nature. Bit guards are permissible.
- Any gimmicks (e.g. nerve lines, tongue ties, gag bits, any bit that acts as a gag, tack nosebands etc.) are not permitted. Nose nets are permissible.
- The stirrup iron and stirrup leather must hang freely from the bar of the saddle and the outside flap; there must be no restrictions or attachments of any kind.
- Girths/Cinches: of suitable material in good repair.
- Draw reins are not permitted.
- Whips more than 75 cm in length are not permitted, unless used for lunging.

Show Grounds Rules

- Please park in the designated parking area.
- Motorized vehicles such as Golf Carts, Dirt Bikes, ATV's, are not permitted.
- **Dogs are NOT PERMITTED on the show grounds.**
- Campfires are not permitted on the property at any time.
- Hacking in rings will be permitted until told to exit by show management.
- Horse owners/riders/exhibitors are responsible for their own horses safety and welfare while on the show grounds.
- **THERE ARE NO STALLS AVAILABLE ON THE SHOW GROUNDS.**
- Adequate feed and water are the owners' responsibility. BRING YOUR OWN FEED AND WATER BUCKETS. Water is available on grounds.
- Clean up after yourself at the designated trailer area.
 - a. Take manure with you, or spread across grass.
 - b. No hay piles left behind.
 - c. Clean up any garbage.

Equestrian Canada Statement of Principle

- EQUESTRIAN CANADA, the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to the humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.
- EQUESTRIAN CANADA is committed to:
 - a. Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, is a primary consideration in all activities.
 - b. Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and compassion that they deserve and that they will never be subjected to mistreatment.
 - c. Ensuring that owners, trainers, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare. Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.
- Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.
- Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses. The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.
- All participants at Everett Horse Show are expected to abide by this statement of Principle.
